ADVENT 2: THE CANDLE OF PEACE

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. - John 14: 27



For this Sunday's service, Orion asked me to include a reading that has been meaningful to me over the years. I immediately thought of this paragraph from Frederick Buechner's book *Now and Then: A Memoir of Vocation*. Buechner was a favorite author in my early days of ministry. While I might not be as enamored of his theology (or exclusive language) at this point in my life, I will always admire his vulnerability, insight, and wisdom in sharing his own story of faith and doubt. My story resonates with his.

There is no event so commonplace but that God is present within it, always hiddenly, always leaving you room to recognize him or not recognize him, but all the more fascinatingly because of that, all the more compellingly and hauntingly... if I were called upon to state in a few words the essence of everything I was trying to say both as a novelist and as a preacher, it would be something like this: Listen to your life. See it for the fathomless mystery it is. In the boredom and pain of it, no less than in the excitement and gladness: touch, taste, smell your way to the holy and hidden heart of it, because in the last analysis all moments are key moments, and life itself is grace.
